Simple Past vs. Present Perfect Simple - English Grammar

Past simple = I worked Present perfect = I have worked Definite time in the past We use the past simple to refer to definite time in the past (when we specify the time or how long) and usually with past time expressions such as yesterday, two weeks ago, last year, in 1995: We met in January 1975.

Past simple or present perfect? - English Grammar Today ...

Both Present Perfect and Past Simple are used to talk about a completed action. The difference is the following: Present Perfect denotes recent actions and events which are connected with the present. Past Simple denotes actions and events in finished time periods (last week, yesterday, at the weekend, etc.). With the present perfect, we cannot use a specific time in the past such as 'yesterday' or 'in 2008.' We use the present perfect when we talk about 1) actions that happened at an unspecified time in the past, 2) actions in a period that has not finished yet, and 3) actions that began in the past and continue to the present.
